# WORSHIP NOTES

## From The Worship Ministries

### *Jesus is Risen! He is Risen indeed!*

Leading up to the Easter service when we make this profound declaration are services telling the story of Jesus final few days.



### *Palm Sunday* (service begins at 9:30 am)

Process into church singing “Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord” and “All Glory, Laud and Honor” as we celebrate Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem. Pastor Kevin will share with us the Gospel from Matthew 21:1-11 telling of that ‘triumphal’ parade. Palm crosses will be available to all.

### *Maundy Thursday* (service begins at 7:00 pm)

Tonight Jesus and the Twelve prepared to celebrate the Passover Feast. We will be sharing Communion with the blessing of the bread and wine by Pastor Kevin around tables set up in front of the angel windows. The altar will be stripped as Jesus leads his disciples to Gethsemane to pray and begin the journey to the cross. This service will continue tomorrow night on Good Friday.

### *Good Friday* (service begins at 7:00 pm)

The church is semi-dark with 7 candles lit across the altar. A tall, black cross is processed in and placed at the altar. We hear the story of Jesus’ arrest, questioning by Annas and Pontius Pilate, the beating and mocking by the guards, Peter’s denial, his crucifixion and finally, his death and burial in a borrowed tomb. The candles are extinguished one by one. We leave in darkness. Waiting for the promise of Easter, of the Resurrection of Christ.

### *Easter Sunday* (service begins at 9:30 am)

### **A Glorious Day! Jesus Christ is Risen Today! Alleluia!**

The wait is over! Come, join in the celebration.
